It received **140** responses, a response rate of **72%**. Responses came from **73** sisters and **67** brothers and priests.



Conclusion: **FAMILY** and **PARISH PRIESTS**, alongside **CATHOLIC SCHOOLS**, provide optimal environments for a vocational call to growth.


